Fifteenth Field Artillery

The 15th Field Artillery Regiment consisted of HQ Company, Supply Company and two battalions. The <u>1st Battalion</u> consisted of HQ detachment, Batteries A, B and C. The 2nd Battalion consisted of HQ detachment, Batteries D, E, F and G. Each battalion had a combat train, ammunition train and supply train. (Ed.)

TIME AND PLACE OF ORGANIZATION. Syracuse, N. Y., June 1, 1917.

Commanding Officers.

Lieut Col. Thomas E. Merrill (June 1, 1917—May 5, 1918).

Date of Arrival in France. White Star Line S. S. Adriatic Dec. 27, 1917.

[Arrived at Liverpool, December 25th, 1917. Battery E Goes to War]

Training Periods. Equipped with French materiel at Valdahon, France, and trained for two months under French instructors, Dec 30, 1917, to March 18, 1918. Divisional maneuvers at Dellincourt, Oise, from May 19 to May 31, 1918.

Verdun Sector. First Battalion in Troyon sub-sector, supporting Ninth Infantry. Second Battalion in Rupt sub-sector, supporting Twenty-Third Infantry. Considerable counter preparation fire executed until May 10.

Aisne Marne Defensive (Chateau Thierry). Supported attacks of Fifth and Sixth Marines on Bois de Belleau, June 6—25. Supported Third Brigade attack on Vaux July 1, firing 6000 rounds of mustard gas as preliminary preparation. Averaged 3000 rounds daily during this period. Relieved by a regiment of the Twenty-Sixth American Division, July 9.

Aisne Marne Offensive (Soissons). Assembled in Villers Cotterets forest for Soissons attack. Fired rolling barrage and advanced in close support of infantry during initial attack of July 18, firing constantly day and night until the morning of July 20, when the division was relieved. Remained in line to support attacks of the French, July 20—25.

Marbache Sector. Pont-à-Mousson sub-sector from August 5—23. Very quiet.

St. Mihiel Offensive. From position just east of Limey, First Battalion fired rolling barrage, while Second Battalion crossed No Mans Land behind the attacking infantry. After attack had progressed both battalions took up position behind Thiaucourt, Sept. 12, 1918. Relieved Sept. 16—17.

Meuse Argonne Offensive (Champagne). Went into position behind Somme-Py Oct. 2. On Oct. 3, fired rolling barrage and advanced to positions north of Somme-Py and two kilometers southeast of Medeah Farm. From Oct. 4 to Oct. 10. engaged in considerable firing of barrages, zone and harassing fire, and heavy shelling of large German depots and railhead in vicinity of Machault. Regiment supported 36th American Division after relief of 2nd Division infantry. Followed advance of 36th Division through Vaux-Champagne, Chufilley, Coulommes et Marqueny, and Machault to Aisne river. Relieved Oct. 27—28.

Argonne Meuse Offensive. Fired many barrages and kept pace with the rapid advance of the infantry Nov. I-II. Occupied various positions near Landres et St. George, Landreville, Bayonville, Nouart, Fosse, La Forge Farm, Beaumont and Yoncq. From Yoncq positions fired 7000 rounds to cover Fourth Brigade crossing of the Meuse, night Nov. I—II.

March to the Rhine. Marched via Beaumont, Stenay, Montmedy, Virton, Chenois, Christach [sic Christnach], Waltbillig [sic Waldbillig], crossing German border Dec. 1. Passed through Eifel and Rhine province via Neunahr. Crossed Rhlne at Remagen Dec. 13, going into permanent billets in Wollendorf-Fahr area.



Chaplain's Corner with Chaplain Wes Hodgins

THE VERSE FOR TODAY (not a substitute for systematic reading of Scripture and study of particular doctrines but rather a step along the way of life) DEUTERONOMY 7:25-26 "You shall burn the carved images of their gods with fire, you shall not covet the silver or gold that is on them, nor take it for yourselves, lest you be snared by it, for it is an abomination to the LORD your God. Nor shall you bring an abomination into your house, lest you be doomed to destruction like it. You shall utterly detest it and utterly abhor it, for it is an accursed thing."

Moses here gives the people a solemn warning about the subtle dangers which they <u>will encounter</u> as they move into the promised land. Satan, like a fleeing army deliberately lays land mines to delay and thwart the larger attacking force, will lay "spiritual-snares" which will hinder and destroy the spiritual-life of this people! These "land-mines" will come in the shards of their idol worship: 'images' depicting sexually-debasing-pleasure and valuable rare metals of intrinsic value covering the idols.

The command here is for the People of the Covenant to utterly destroy <u>all</u> visages of the idol worship which has permeated the promised land. The reason for this "cleansing" is clearly given. "<u>ANY</u>" trace of this wicked-worship will multiply inconspicuously like germs in an open wound. Initially all may seem well; but the end will be a resurgence of the wickedness leading to judgment from the LORD! This was Satan's attack through Balaam at Peor. It was largely successful, and many people died there before entering the promised land. <u>Everything</u> related to the idol worship was to be destroyed & removed from the land. All was to be "abhorred & detested" and buried in the local landfill; <u>totally removed</u> from public view.

It is important to notice that the command to "cleanse" the land does not stop with the physical accomplishment of it. Even the largest of physical tasks will one-day come to an end; the goal will have been achieved, the building will be completed. The "maintenance" of the "purity-achieved" will be sustained with the right "heart-attitude". The people were to "detest" and "abhor" all of those things; They were <u>not</u> to secretly "love" any of it nor "rationalize" the re-use / re-purpose of the gold or silver. <u>Anything</u> that brought the favorable remembrance of the idol worship was to be "utterly-destroyed"!

There is a clear message for God's People, the today. Paul wrote to the Church at Rome: "I beseech you ... that you present your bodies ... holy, acceptable unto the LORD. (12:1-2) James wrote to the early Church: "Pure and undefiled religion before God and the Father is this ... to keep oneself unspotted from the world". (1:27) The World cries for "tolerance" of folks who do not believe God's Word; and are "intolerant" of any who oppose them. They applaud lotteries, promising huge sums to "winners" but deplore saving for things and trusting God for sustenance. Check your "compliance" with "purity" today.
