#### 7/15th PUTS STEEL INTO CAMBODIA

DUC CO -- From a raid site laid at the border village of Duc Co, 7th Battalion, 15th Field Artillery recently delivered heavy fire support into Cambodia



Located five miles from the Cambodian border, the "Fighting Fifteenth" expended rounds on selected enemy locations as reconned by the II Military Region Ranger border camp. Surveillance credited the artillery unit with a massive secondary explosion as a result of their fire.



The field unit, under the command of B Battery Commander, Captain Norman R. Cherry, was comprised of "Association for Peace III", a 175mm gun from A Battery, Fire Support Base Blackhawk, and "God of Hell Fire", a 175mm gun from B Battery, Fire Support Base Oasis.



The road march to the site, 20 miles southwest of FSB Oasis, necessitated a 50-mile journey for the A Battery gun. Both heavies closed on the site in early morning after negotiating hazardous "Rocket Alley", a 1-1/2 mile stretch of road which had been the scene of hostile action the previous day.

After quickly laying the guns, the crews manned their positions until late afternoon before receiving the march order. The convoy then displaced 30 miles to Artillery Hill, Pleiku.

# Army unit relocating in Anniston

TALLADEGA — The third battalion of the 15th Field Artillery of the U.S. Army Reserve is being transferred to Alabama, with its headquarters to be located at Ft. McClellan, U.S. Rep. Bill Nichols told Talladega Kiwanis Tuesday.

"This transfer of the third battalion of the 15th Field Artillery is one of several Army reserve units to be relocated under the brigade improvement program," Nichols said. "Under this move, there will be batteries stationed in Talladega, Gadsden, Cullman, each under the command of the Anniston headquarters."

Anniston will have an authorized troop strength of 171 positions, including 17 officers, two warrant officers and 152

enlisted men.

Talladega will have three officers and 99 enlisted men. Twelve of the 18 field guns or tubes will be stationed in Anniston, with two each at the other locations, he said.

No personnel will actually be moved to Anniston, just the slots, the congressman said.

The impact on the total economy is anticipated to total \$234,500 in Anniston and \$119,230 in Talladega, primarily derived from pay and state and local taxes. The transfer of the unit will be effective July 23 with numerous openings available.


